

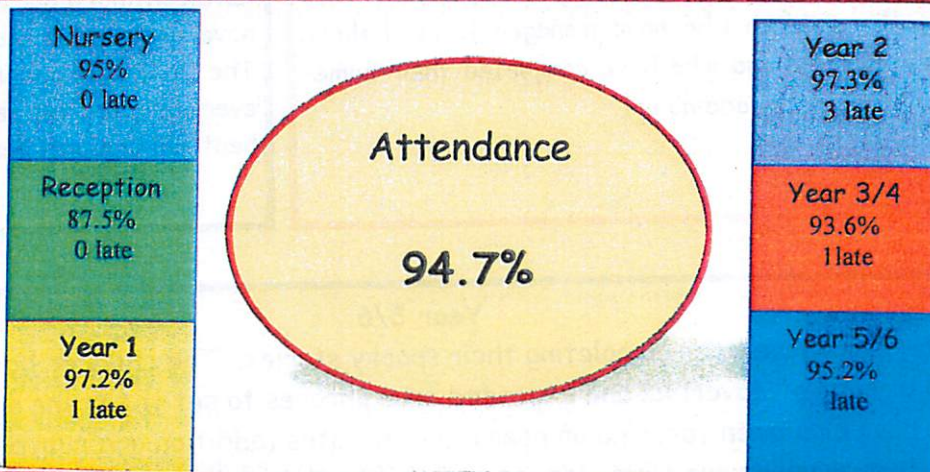

Year 2

In owl class this week we have been working on team games and learning rules. We are realising how important working as a team is! We had a great session on Thursday afternoon participating in Zumba as a reward for the highest attendance. Win talk for writing we have learned a non-fiction text about how balls bounce! Year 1

In Year 1 this week we have been learning the story of Jack and the Beanstalk. We have created a text map and actions to help us retell the story. We have been working really hard on our writing and have produced some brilliant pieces of work. In Maths we have been learning how to find and say the number that is one more/one less than a given number up to 20. Well done to all of the children who have managed to read three times per week at home and who have completed their homework. Your points are really adding up!

Year 3/4

This week in Badger class we have had a busy week. In our Talk for Writing lessons we have been writing a dilemma story and adding in adverbs to make it more exciting for the reader. In maths, we have continued our work on place value, looking at rounding and negative numbers in Year 4 and practicing adding and taking away 10 and 100 in year 3. In topic, we have continued our work on predators and have designed our own predatory plants! The Daily Mile continues to be enjoyed by everyone, and we're all working hard to beat our personal bests!

Year 5/6

This week, Fox class have been completing their spooky stories. The children have been really creative and used a range of adverbial and expanded noun phrases to set the scene and engage their readers. We have also been focusing on operations in maths (addition and subtraction). Miss Bridge is also busy working our first class trip of the year! Details will follow as soon as possible. Please note that PE days are now Mondays and Wednesdays—so PE kits need to be in school on these days. Also, homework is set on Fridays and needs to be returned on Tuesdays. Please remember to sign your child's planner if they have read at home.
