Year 3/4

Our focus this week has been anti-bullying. We have looked at ways we are unique and how each of us contributes to the community that is our classroom! We found out that some of us have great talents such as being able to design and make our own clothes, beat-boxing or baking. We also looked at the different ways that bullying can happen, such as face-to-face or online. We looked at the acronym STOP (Several Times On Purpose) and what this meant too, and sang along to a very catchy song called 'Unique' by Andy and the Odd Socks!

In maths, we have continued our work on subtraction, and in English we have been changing *The Lion*, *The Witch* and *The Wardrobe* to different settings, which has resulted in great ideas and lovely stories.

Year 2

This week in year 2 we had a visit from a pirate who left us some clues to follow his treasure hunt. We read them really carefully and followed them and found his buried treasure. We have also been looking at the United Kingdom and its surrounding seas and next we are going to find out about which seas pirates sailed on. In maths we have continued our work on addition and subtraction using base 10 to help us partition and exchange 10's. We have adapted a pirate story in literacy by thinking of our own characters to make the story different. We came up with some fantastic new characters!

This week we have been working on our drama skills when we act out our Talk for Writing story. The children are becoming more confident in their story telling, developing their ideas which then extend their speech and language skills. The shared writing which we are doing is also developing the children's imaginations, giving great story tales, which we share in groups and talk about how we could improve them. We have also been taking part in anti-bullying week, making sure we are a good friend and be kind, caring and respectful of others. We had fun looking at all the odd socks we wore on Monday showing that we are all unique but have many similarities too. Year 5/6

This week we had our visit to Cusworth Hall to explore the lives of Victorian children. We used some of the learning from the visit to write a diary entry focusing on the lives of Victorian children in the workhouse. We have also started our new class book - *The Boy in the Striped Pyjamas*. Furthermore, we have taken part in anti-bullying week and we really enjoyed our parent/child workshop, where we created posters to focus on what bully is and what we can do about it. Safeguarding
